RALSTON WALKING TRACK IMPROVEMENT

- Current condition unsatisfactory and unappealing
- Exercise & fitness benefits well-being of residents
- Better surface for local groups (i.e. Mendham Magic)
- Sports teams at the park for games and practices could utilize the track for warm-ups and families could take advantage of exercise while waiting during a practice.

Recreation Commission is seeking:

 \$6,000 in funds from the town for resurfacing of walking track







RALSTON PLAYGROUND PROJECT

- Full playground to be done in phases
- Recreation Commission fundraising efforts exceed \$80,000 for Phase I. Donations include:
 - · Private resident donations
 - Buy-a-brick campaign partnering w/ West Morris Junior Women's Club
 - · Patriots' 5K Race & Kids' Fun Run
- Phase I will open Spring 2018

Recreation Commission is seeking:

 \$80,000 from the town for Phase II to complete the playground project





BROOKSIDE BEACH

- Decades-old place for families to meet and build a sense of community; it's a unique part of Mendham!
- Source of employment for local teenagers/young adults
- · A safe place for young teens to hang out with friends
- Promote as a destination for summer camps, including three for local children.
- Weekend rentals for private parties and other special occasions.

Recreation Commission is seeking:

- \$15,000 for dredging and required EPA permits
- \$11,000 for new aerators
- \$9,000 for facility upgrade of equipment and activities
