Required actions and maintenance during the 1 year service life of the practice includes: a) mulched areas will be periodically inspected, and mulch shall be reinstalled or repaired as needed to accomplish the intended purpose b) evaluate the effectiveness of the mulch (application, amount of cover provided, durability, etc.) and adjust the management or of type of mulch to better meet the intended purpose(s) c) removal or incorporation of mulch materials shall be consistent with the intended purpose and site conditions d) operation of equipment near and on the site shall not compromise the intended purpose of the mulch e) prevent or repair any fire damage to the mulch material.
