#### **OPEN TO THE PUBLIC**

Mayor Monaghan opened the meeting for public comments.

Kim Hart, 17 North Gate Road, Mendham, NJ read a prepared statement regarding the proposed Backer Brewery Project. Ms. Hart strongly opposes this project.

Kim Schoenholtz, 8 Hunters Glen, Mendham, NJ had three questions regarding the Mosle Bond Ordinance. When will the Township issue the debt, is there a written agreement for scheduled payments and the last question is there a list of items pertaining to the \$103,000.00. Mr. Gabloff explained that is for soft costs. The debt will not be issued until the project starts and the final costs are known. The agreement is in progress.

Peter Banos, 47 Ironia Road, Mendham, NJ commented on the revised proposed Backer Brewery application. Strongly opposes the project. The Township Committee suggested that Mr. Banos send questions to the Morris County Ag Board regarding the application.

Anthony Reitano, 3 Carriage Hill Drive, Mendham, NJ commented on the traffic at the end of the June 30, 2023, fireworks event at Mosle Field. Traffic was worse than in past years. Mr. Reitano also commented on the Hunting Resolution that is on the agenda and inquired about the State Statue pertaining to hunting.

Kristen Barber, 5 Carriage Hill Drive, Mendham, NJ participated via Zoom further commented on the hunting that will be allowed in and around Mosle Field. Ms. Barber further commented on the traffic after the fireworks event at Mosle Field and parking issues. Was not able to leave her own driveway as cars blocked it.

George Koenig, 13 North Gate Road, Mendham, NJ read a statement written by Mrs. Koenig titled "Bait & Switch". The statement was regarding the proposed Backer Brewery Project which Mr. & Mrs. Koenig strongly oppose.

Diana Orban Brown, 100 Ironia Road, Mendham, NJ commented on the Mosle Field Light ordinance and why it's being fast tracked. Concerned how the Township will secure payment from Twin Boro Bears for their portion of the expense.

Ed Coury, 87 Mosle Road, Mendham, NJ opposes proposed Mosle Field Lighting project. Doesn't agree with the Environmental Impact Statement that was conducted.

Committeewoman Spirig read a statement sent in by Nicholas Kraus, 10 Carriage Hill Drive, Mendham, NJ. Asking for clarification on no additional use and traffic as well as quantity of practices

Todd Christie, 1 Tall Oaks Court, Mendham, NJ participated via Zoom commented that the age group participating in the Twin Boro Bears football program range from 6-14 years of age. Mr. Christie supports the proposed Mosle Field Light project.

Norman Menz, 81 Mosle Road, Far Hills, NJ is a resident of Peapack-Gladstone Boro but has been in the area for many years and strongly opposes the proposed Mosle Field Light project.

Elisa Wyman, 4 Parkwood Lane, Mendham, NJ commented that lights have been used at Mosle field for many years and concerned about the safety of children while using the field.

Seeing and hearing no one else wishing to be heard, Mayor Monaghan asked for a motion to close public comments.

Ms. Duarte made a motion to close the public comment period seconded by Ms. Neibart. A voice vote was taken with all members present voting in favor, no one opposed.

Andrew Wyman, 4 Parkwood Lane, Mendham, NJ participated via Zoom. Mr. Wyman is on the Executive committee and treasurer for the Twin Boro Bears. He further commented that the Mosle Lighting project hasn't gotten anywhere in 18 months and that the parking lot needs to be addressed for safety concerns.

Seeing and hearing no one else wishing to be heard, Mayor Monaghan asked for a motion to close public comments.

Ms. Duarte made a motion to close the public comment period seconded by Ms. Spirig. A voice vote was taken with all members present voting in favor, no one opposed.

### **DISCUSSION**

Ms. Neibart followed up on the Mosle Advisory Committee. Suggested that a resident from the area be added to the Recreation Committee to be able to keep informed of events taking place at Mosle after the proposed lighting project is finished. This position would need to be created within the Recreation Committee which will require amending the Recreation Committee Ordinance to define the rules of the position.

Ms. Neibart requested that the August 14, 2023, Township Committee meeting be moved to August 16, 2023, at 6:30pm in the Elementary School.

# RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MENDHAM PROVIDING FOR A MEETING NOT OPEN TO THE PUBLIC IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE NEW JERSEY OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12

**WHEREAS,** the Township Committee of the Township of Mendham is subject to certain requirements of the <u>Open Public Meetings Act</u>, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6, et seq.; and

**WHEREAS,** the <u>Open Public Meetings Act</u>, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12, provides that an Executive Session, not open to the public, may be held for certain specified purposes when authorized by Resolution; and

session	<b>AS,</b> it is necessary for the Township Committee of the Township of Mendham to discuss in a not open to the public certain matters relating to the item or items authorized by N.J.S.A. 10:4-designated below:
	(1) Matters Required by Law to be Confidential: Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.
	(2) Matters Where the Release of Information Would Impair the Right to Receive Funds: Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the Government of the United States.
	(3) Matters Involving Individual Privacy: Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.
	(4) Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreements: Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.
	(5) Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease or Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds: Any matter involving the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.
	(6) Matters Relating to Public Safety and Property: Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations of possible violations of the law.
	(7) Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations, and the Attorney-Client Privilege: Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.

(8) Matters Relating to the Employment Relationship: Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all the individual employees or appointees whose right could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting.
(9) Matters Relating to the Potential Imposition of a Penalty: Any deliberations of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the responding party bears responsibility.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Mendham, in the County of Morris, State of New Jersey, assembled in public session on **July 10, 2023 at 6:30 P.M**. in the Mendham Township Elementary School, 18 West Main St., Brookside, New Jersey, that the Township Committee shall meet in Executive Session, from which the public shall be excluded, for the discussion of matters relating to the specific items designated above.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that it is anticipated that the deliberations conducted in closed session may be disclosed to the public upon the determination of the Township Committee that the public interest will no longer be served by such confidentiality.

## ORDINANCE NO. 06-2023 TOWNSHIP OF MENDHAM COUNTY OF MORRIS, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION OF \$2,000,000 FOR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS IN AND BY THE TOWNSHIP OF MENDHAM, IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS, NEW JERSEY, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,904,500 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MENDHAM, IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS, NEW JERSEY (with not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance have heretofore been authorized to be undertaken by the Township of Mendham, in the County of Morris, New Jersey (the "Township") as general improvements. For the improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the supplemental amount of \$2,000,000, such sum being in addition to the \$5,600,000 appropriated therefor by bond ordinance #12-2020 of the Township, finally adopted October 27, 2020, as supplemented by bond ordinance #11-2022 of the Township, finally adopted July 25, 2022 (collectively, the "Original Bond Ordinance"), with \$1,885,000 of the \$2,000,000 supplemental appropriation being for the renovation of the Township Hall as described in Section 3(a) thereof and with \$115,000 of the \$2,000,000 supplemental appropriation being for the construction of the police station as described in Section 3(b) thereof, and including the sum of \$95,500 as the additional down payment required by the Local Bond Law. The additional down payment is now available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the additional cost of the improvements or purposes not covered by application of the additional down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$1,904,500 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. The improvements hereby and heretofore authorized and the purposes for which the bonds are to be issued, the supplemental appropriation for each purpose, the estimated additional amount of bonds or notes to be issued for each purpose and the period of usefulness of each purpose are as follows:

- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the improvements or purposes is \$7,224,500, including the \$5,320,000 authorized by the Original Bond Ordinance and the \$1,904,500 bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized herein, with \$2,940,000 available from the Original Bond Ordinance and \$1,795,000 made available herein for a total of \$4,735,000 for the Township Hall as described in Section 3(a) and with \$2,380,000 available from the Original Bond Ordinance and \$109,500 made available herein for a total of \$2,489,500 for the police station as described in Section 3(b).
- (c) The estimated cost of the improvements or purposes is \$7,600,000, including the \$5,600,000 appropriated by the Original Bond Ordinance and the \$2,000,000 appropriated herein, with \$3,100,000

appropriated in the Original Bond Ordinance and \$1,885,000 appropriated herein for a total of \$4,985,000 for the Township Hall as described in Section 3(a) and with \$2,500,000 appropriated in the Original Bond Ordinance and \$115,000 appropriated herein for a total of \$2,615,000 for the police station as described in Section 3(b).

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no bond anticipation note shall mature later than one year from its date, unless such bond anticipation notes mature at such later date in accordance with applicable law. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The Township hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited, and stated:

(a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance is not a current expense. They are improvements or purposes that the Township may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.

- (b) The average period of usefulness, computed on the basis of the respective amounts of obligations authorized for the supplemental amounts set forth for each purpose and the reasonable life thereof within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, is 10.57 years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. - Section 8. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MENDHAM, IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS, NEW JERSEY (with not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Township of Mendham, in the County of Morris, New Jersey (the "Township") as a general improvement. For the improvement or purpose described in Section 3(a), there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$515,000, including the sum of \$25,750 as the down payment required by the Local Bond Law. \$12,875 of the down payment is now available from a contribution from the Twin Boro Bears, and \$12,875 of the down payment is now available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in one or more previously adopted budgets.

The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. # RE: REPLACING CHAPTER 245 SECTION 2 SUBSECTION A OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MENDAHAM (PARKS AND RECREATIONAL FACILITIES)

Whereas, the Township Committee of the Township of Mendham has deemed it advisable to delete a portion of Chapter 245, Section 2, subsection A and replace the same in its entirety:

**Now Therefore BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Mendham as follows: **SECTION ONE:** 

Existing Chapter 245, Section2, subsection A is deleted and replaced in its entirety with the following;

### § 245-2. PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES.

#### **NO PERSON SHALL:**

A. Enter, remain in or conduct any activity whatsoever in any Township Park during the period commencing at 9:00 PM on any day and ending 1/2 hour before sunrise on the following morning. Any use after 1/2 hour after sunset, but before 9:00 PM must:

- 1. Gain approval by application for use to the Recreation Committee.
- 2. Once approved by the Recreation Committee, be placed on a resolution approving use with the Township Committee. Township Committee meetings to approve usage hours after sunset, but before 9:00 PM, shall be noticed to all neighbors within 200' of any athletic field.
- 3. If approved, neighbors within 200' will receive quarterly schedules with approved usage after dark from the Recreation Director.
- 4. The additional below guidelines shall be put into place for Mosle Field:
  - II. Sports League use of Mosle Field lights shall be restricted to the period between August 15 and November 15 and use may not surpass 5:30-8:30 PM Monday through Friday. The additional half hour period between 8:30-9:00 PM shall strictly be for clean-up.
  - III. For Profit Organizations are prohibited from being permitted to use Mosle Field. The use of Mosle Sports fields is strictly for the use of Mendham Based Sports Non-Profit Organizations.

#### **SECTION TWO:**

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason found to be unconstitutional or unenforceable, such decision shall not affect the remaining portion of this ordinance.

#### **SECTION THREE:**

All ordinances of the Township of Mendham which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

#### **SECTION FOUR:**

This ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication thereof as provided by law.

WHEREAS, as a result of the interior demolition by Houran and the removal of plaster due to potential asbestos, Cornerstone Architectural Group (CAG) was able to examine the structural condition of the building and determined that significant structural modifications were required and the existing sprinkler system needed to be replaced; and

**WHEREAS,** the rehabilitation contract of Houran was suspended pending the resolution of these deficiencies; and

**WHEREAS,** CAG prepared revised structural plans, provided these plans to Houran in April, and received a proposal (change order) of the cost to accomplish the cited work; and

WHEREAS, in this change order Houran has agreed that he will address all known deficiencies in the building; and

WHEREAS, CAG has reviewed the Houran proposal as to completeness and compliance with the revisions, and through negotiations Houran and the Township Administration have agreed to a change order value of \$1,500,000 that includes accomplishing all the required work, rehabilitation of the existing pantry and certain countertops, plus any and all damages / payments due to the project delay / project extension; and
